

Cook County School District 130 Uniform Policy

Grades 6-8

Shirts: Light Blue (preferred) or white short sleeve or long sleeve polo shirts. White dress shirts/blouses are also allowed. Shirts must be tucked in neatly.

Layering: Plain sweater, sweatshirts, sweater vests, and cardigans (buttoned or zipped) are allowed to be worn over the school polo. The sweater, sweatshirt, sweater vest, and cardigan must be plain or have the school logo. The sweater, sweatshirt, sweater vest, and cardigan can be light blue, black, gray, or navy blue. Hooded sweatshirts or hooded tops of any kind are not allowed to be worn inside school. The collar of the school shirt must be visible when layers are worn over it. Solid white, light blue, black, gray, or navy blue long sleeved t-shirts, thermal shirts or turtlenecks are allowed underneath the school shirt for warmth. No designs or logos should be visible when wearing the undershirts, unless it is the school logo. Scarves or bandanas are not allowed to be worn during the school day.

Pants: Navy (preferred) or black flat front or pleated dress pants. Pants must be maintained in good condition (no rips or tears). No cargo style pants or tight form fitting pants allowed. No jeans, denim or "jeans-like" fabric, no brads or rivets.

Skorts: Navy (preferred) or black flat front or pleated skorts are allowed for girls. The length should be at or below fingertip length when the arms are by the sides. Tights may be worn but must be solid black, gray, white, or navy.

Long shorts/Bermuda shorts: Navy flat front or pleated long shorts/Bermuda shorts are allowed. Elastic waist is acceptable. The length should be at or below fingertip length when the arms are by the sides.

Belts: Belts are optional. Must be a plain black or dark brown belt with a plain buckle.

Socks/Tights: Socks should cover the entire foot. If tights are worn, they must be plain, without prints or stripes.

Shoes: Any color shoe allowed. The heel should be 1.5 inches or less. Any closed toe gym shoe or athletic shoe is allowed (no calf, knee high sport shoes, or wedge athletic shoes allowed). Laces or Velcro closures are acceptable. Winter/fashion boots may be worn to school, but not throughout the school day.

Jewelry, hats, etc.: Jewelry must be discrete and non-distracting. Boys may not wear earrings. Boys cannot cover up earrings with bandages, tape, or have other devices inserted in their ears. Chains must be tucked inside the shirt. No facial jewelry or industrial piercings (plugs) allowed. No tattoos. No baseball hats to be worn on school property.

Special occasions: School picture days are non-uniform days. Certain field trips or other special events (award ceremonies, PBIS rewards, etc.) may also be non-uniform days, at the discretion of the Principal. Parents and students will be notified of non-uniform dress days in advance. On Dress Down Days, students should wear clean, neat clothing that is not vulgar or suggestive. Tight, form fitting pants or leggings are not acceptable. Shorts, skirts and dresses should be to fingertip length or longer.

Final decision on any item will be made by the school administrators.
